Explore campfire seating, ravine stairs, 360-views and more in the Sam Ibrahim Building



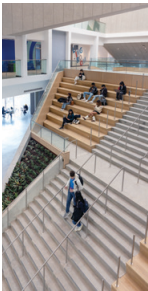

With a boxy layout and cues from nearby Highland Creek, the Sam Ibrahim Building is built to inspire collaboration in unexpected ways. Spaces include a first-floor “living room”—with stairs that flow like a ravine and seating next to plant beds. The building is also technologically ready with a 500-seat campfire style hall and a 200-seat Collaboratorium—specifically designed for group work and dialogue. No two classrooms are alike.

Did you know?

The Sam Ibrahim Building’s energy performance is 40 per cent more efficient than building industry standards thanks to its green roof, high thermal insulation design and geothermal power.
